- **1. Apologies and Intros** Joy Squires, Zoe Fisher, Julie May Adams, Laurence Green. In absence of Joy, Graham took the chair. New members were welcomed.
- 2. Notes of meeting on 13 November accepted as true record. Noted that we were still looking for volunteers for the management committee.
- 3. The **website** was now up and running, thanks to Matt for this work. ARA to be added as a link. The information would make it clear we were seeking new members as "friends", not just volunteers. New members can join via the website
- 4. Links/partnerships the Group needs to get as many links as possible.
 - a. CRT noted that a successful open day had been held at Tardebigge recently, looking at lock works, next year could be in Diglis. Reed growths were raised, esp in Blockhouse area, Suzanne confirmed that CRT had been clearing excessive growth and navigation was not impeded but wildlife issues needed to be taken into account.
 - b. Worcs Wildlife Trust. Adam to write to them to see if they had any involvement in the canal or specific work done on wildlife surveys.
 - c. Landsdowne Allotment Assoc. Paul to make contact.
 - d. Anglers. Graham had met Colin Pettifer of the Worcs and District Utd Anglers for a useful discussion including bailiff's rights, annual dredging for obstructive rubbish and pollution.
 - e. Transition Worcester had agreed to promote the group in a monthly newsletter. Adam to do.
 - f. Businesses. Ivan is approaching local businesses for contact and possible sponsorship.
 - g. U3A. To be approached for potential membership (Adam)
 - h. WRGS. Ivan establishing contact.

5. Projects

- a. Litterpicking taking place last Saturday in each month next one on 25th Jan. Matt sending out invites, also posters on site. Noted need for barge for February for rubbish in water.
- b. Lansdowne landscaping. Rod gave update and explained plans for wildlife garden and canal-side apple tree planting. Ivan proposed a small workgroup to steer it of himself, Rod, Debbie, Paul and Matt, scheduled for Weds 29th Jan to report back on progress at next meeting. Project to be backed up by as many volunteers as possible to carry out the works. ARA will be the fundholder.

- c. Barkers Wharf. John Cowie described how he (and the City planners) had been involved in negotiation in the St Modwen scheme for new housing with a canalside landscaped area including interpretative panels. Thanks to John for his efforts.
- d. Other developments. The Group is interested in what else is proposed along the canal and Adam has asked the City Planning Office to consult WCG on all canalside developments. Volunteers are asked for with an interest in planning and development to assist in reviewing proposals.
- e. Public Art. Some proposals are emerging for public art esp a project for the Worcs/Droitwich ring. Members are interested in participating in this.
- f. Bicentennial 1815. Early warning and thoughts needed of how to celebrate.
- g. Cycling. David Ritchie passed on a useful note from the Inland Waterways Assoc about towpath cycling. This is a topic worth a project in its own right raise at next meeting.
