- 1. **Apologies and Intros** Paul Brohan, Nathaniel Pitt, Deborah Merrick (Worcester City Council), Alan Gordon. New members (Mike, Amelia and Scott) were welcomed.
- 2. Notes of meeting on 21 January accepted as true record. Noted that we were still working on contacts with U3A, Transition Worcester and WRGS for the management committee. Joy explained about the interpretive signs on the Barkers Wharf scheme, which was to be done by Autumn. Suzanne said CRT would be taking action to cut back reed beds, after the nesting season. She was also looking for volunteers to be trained as deck hands for the barge. Julie-May and Graham volunteered.

- c. General discussion about canal-side trees.
- d. David Ritchie raised issues about cycling, which was felt to be a positive use but some cyclists needed to be more considerate. Advice will be added to website and leaflet. Warning signs could be improved, and some additional speed controls. Other cycling partners were discussed
- 6. **Promotion** A simple leaflet to be prepared, based on website, to promote the group. (see above).

High-vis jackets which had been purchased by Ivan have had logo added. City Life magazine will be used to support the group, with a publication date in June/July.
